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




How are decisions taken in cities?

SURVEY OBJECTIVES



Address the urban governance 'data challenge'

Establish a platform for individual cities to identify urban governance cases that are of particular relevance to their own specific situations

Explore new ways for communicating and mapping urban governance for public dissemination, comparative policy and research analysis

GOVERNANCE DEFINITIONS...

World Bank 'GOVERNANCE'

Governance consists of the **traditions and institutions** by which authority in a country is exercised. This includes the **process by which governments are selected, monitored and replaced**; the capacity of the government to effectively **formulate and implement sound policies**; and the respect of citizens and the state for the institutions that govern economic and social interactions among them.

UN Habitat 'URBAN GOVERNANCE'

Urban governance is the **sum of the many ways** individuals and institutions, public and private, plan and manage the common affairs of the city. It is a **continuing process** through which **conflicting or diverse interests** may be accommodated and cooperative action can be taken. It includes formal institutions as well as **informal arrangements** and the social capital of citizens.

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UNDP 'GOVERNANCE'


Governance is about the processes by which public policy decisions are made and implemented.

PRELIMINARY RESULTS




- 50 Cities from 5 continents and 30 countries
- 25 cities with a GDP/capita over 20,000 USD
- 29 cities with a population above 500,000


Cities select the governance constraints they are facing


Examples of recent disruptions that have affected the way the local government operates


Level of influence of different tiers of government


State dependent cities (3)

Ex: Artik, Ghent, Istanbul




Financially independent cities (16)

Ex. Gothenburg, Montreal, Philadelphia




National dependent cities (9)

Ex: La Paz, Madrid, Mexico City




Cities Dependent on multiple sources (10)


In what capacity can citizens influence local policies?
